# Summary

The EAGLE Guinea Coordinator met with the Secretary General of the Presidency in charge of Special Services, to discuss issues related to the execution of operations and to strengthen collaboration.

EAGLE Guinea and Guinean Directorate General of Customs signed a Memorandum of Understanding that lays down the framework for collaboration in fighting wildlife crime.

Following an official letter addressed to His Excellency the President of the Republic of Senegal, EAGLE Senegal conducted a comparative study of some African wildlife laws and the judicial treatment of wildlife crime

## Cameroon – LAGA

■ The Deputy Director and the Legal Department held a meeting with the newly appointed Director of Wildlife and Protected Areas to strengthen col-

laboration in the fight against wildlife crime. She was also handed a copy of the LAGA 2025 annual report.

## Republic of the Congo – PALF

■ The Coordinator met and had a discussion with the Head of the INTERPOL National Central Bureau in Brazzaville to strengthen collaboration in the fight against wildlife crime.

■ He held a meeting and discussions with the Director of the Lusaka Agreement Task Force on collaboration in accordance with the MoU signed on November 30, 2022.

## Togo – EAGLE Togo

■ The Coordinator held a meeting with the Inspector General of the Environment, Forest Resources, and Coastal Areas on the judicial handling of illegal wildlife trafficking cases.

■ The Coordinator met with the new Forest Resources Inspector to strengthen collaboration in the fight against wildlife crime.

## Senegal – EAGLE Senegal

- Following an official letter addressed to His Excellency the President of the Republic of Senegal, EAGLE Senegal conducted a comparative study of some African wildlife laws and the judicial treatment of wildlife crime. The aim of this study was to highlight the gap in the fight against wildlife trafficking in the country.
- The Head of the Investigation Department travelled to Conakry to provide investigative support to Guinea project.

## Côte d'Ivoire – EAGLE Côte d'Ivoire

- The Interim Assistant Coordinator held discussions with UCT officials on several issues related to the execution of an operation and strengthening collaboration in the fight against wildlife crime.
- He met with INTERPOL National Central Bureau officials to discuss issues related to the execution of operations and the strengthening of collaboration in the fight against wildlife crime.

## Guinea - EAGLE Guinea

- The Coordinator met with the Secretary General of the Presidency in charge of Special Services, to discuss issues related to the execution of operations and to strengthen collaboration.
- EAGLE Guinea and Guinean Directorate General of Customs signed a Memorandum of Understanding that lays down the framework for collaboration in fighting wildlife crime.
- The Coordinator met with the National Director of the Department for the Regulation and Promotion of Association (DNARPROMA), and the Team followed up the registration application filed with this department that is attached to the Ministry of Territorial Administration and Decentralization.
- She met with some officials of the US Embassy including the Chargé d'Affaires, Public Affairs Officer, and Regional Security Officer to discuss wild-



life crime and to strengthen collaboration in the fight against trafficking. She also held discussions with the Economic Officer at the US Embassy.

- She met with the Head of the INTERPOL National Central Bureau in Conakry to strengthen collaboration in the fight against wildlife crime.
- She held discussions with Head of the TRAFFIC component of the Natura-Guinea Project to strengthen collaboration in the fight against wildlife crime.



## Uganda - EAGLE Uganda

- The Interim Coordinator held meetings with some department heads of government agencies including the Head of the Uganda Revenue Authority Intelligence Department, the Commissioner of Investigations and Intelligence at the Uganda Wildlife Authority and the Uganda Revenue Authority Supervisor for Joint Port Control Unit, to foster collaborations in field operations.
- She liaised with an official of the Uganda Women's Network in Advocacy in analyzing documents that would be of help to the operational permit process.

## THE EAGLE Network

EAGLE: Eco Activists for Governance and Law Enforcement, is a network of members across Africa, who are replicating effectively a program and operational model to undertake wildlife law enforcement, which is based on the LAGA-Cameroon model, trailed, practiced and tested since 2003. The EAGLE Network currently operates in nine African countries and keeps expanding.

The over-arching objective of the EAGLE Network is: *Developing civic activism and collaborating with governments and civil society to improve the application of national and international environmental legislation, through a program of activities: investigations, arrests, prosecutions and publicity. Through this, EAGLE aims to generate a strong deterrent against the illegal*

*trade in wildlife, timber and related criminal activities, including corruption.*
